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Introduction

The ninth edition of the ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS conference took place on 2–4 April at the Aldis Congress Centre in Hradec Králové. Despite the tense flood situation during those days, it has once again confirmed the unique position of this distinct national and international forum for politicians, public administration representatives, specialists and suppliers of information and communication technologies and solutions. Over the two days of the conference, the number of registered participants again exceeded two thousand. Within the conference programme, in six halls there were some 250 lectures and presentations, while more than a hundred exhibitors introduced their products, solutions and services for public administration. The conference was also attended by a host of top political dignitaries. Two months before the elections in the Czech Republic, the strongest political parties presented their plans and intentions in the area of public administration informisation.

The V4 DIS conference, which was held within ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS for the third time in a row, had alongside the traditional issues of e-government and electronic services for citizens of V4 countries another key items on its agenda. Great interest was aroused by gender issues and equal opportunities for women in access to ICT and availability of electronic services provided by public administration. Another extremely interesting topic discussed at V4 DIS was the role of information technologies in tourism, the role of national and regional tourism portals, and the importance of internet promotion of town and municipalities in the tourism sector.

Přemysl Sobotka, Chairman of the Senate of the Parliament of the CR, who assumed the personal auspices over the V4 DIS conference, evaluated the meeting in the following words: “It is not only that this event is at the present time by right considered the most important meeting of its kind, not only in the new EU member states, but primarily the fact that the issues discussed here are closely connected with what we have become used to calling e-government or e-state. The special significance of this conference also rests in the fact that exchange of experience takes place at the level of countries that have common historical experience, similar economic potentials, as well as the same duration of membership of the European Union and, consequently similar problems in some spheres of their activities. Hence, I believe that the participants in this forum will jointly find procedures for projecting new applications of information and communication technologies in public administration.”

The numerous delegations from Visegrad Four countries included, for example, Mr István Szabó, Ambassador of Hungary to the Czech Republic; Mrs Márta Nagy-Rothengass, the present Head of Unit in DG INFSO; Stanislav Borek, Polish chargé d'affaires; Professor Andrzej Janicki from the Alfa-Omega Foundation; Mr Ladislav Balek, Slovak Ambassador to the CR; Mr Pavol Prokopovič, Minister of Transport, Posts and Telecommunications of the Slovak Republic; Mr Ferdinand Vitek, Chairman of the Union of Towns of Slovakia and Mayor of Nitra; and René Kubášek, Deputy Executive Director of the Visegrad Fund.

The ninth edition of the ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS conference took place under the auspices of the Prime Minister of the Czech Republic, Jiří Paroubek, and the Minister of Informatics of the CR, Dana Běrová. Over the two days, a number of other distinguished guests appeared in Hradec Králové – speeches at the gala opening were given by the Chairman of the Senate of the Parliament of the Czech Republic, Přemysl Sobotka, who this year assumed the auspices over the international V4 DIS (Visegrad Four for Developing Information Society) conference, and three ministers of the Government of the CR – the Deputy Prime Minister for the Economy, Jiří Havel; the Minister for Regional Development, Radko Martínek; and the Minister of Informatics, Dana Běrová; as well as the Slovak Minister of Transport, Posts and Telecommunications, Pavol Prokopovič. Other dignitaries were also among the conference guests – the President of the Supreme Control Office, František Dohnal; the regional administrators Evžen Tošenovský and Miloš Vystřčil; the Chairman of the Union of Towns and Municipalities of the Czech Republic, Oldřich Vlasák; Lord Mayors, Mayors, representatives of unions and associations, and many others. Participating in the discussion on the theme of modernisation of public administration in the programme of political parties, which was part of the conference gala opening, were Jiří Havel for the ČSSD (Social Democrats), Mirek Topolánek for the ODS (Civic Democrats), Pavel Severa for the KDU-ČSL (Christian Democrats) and Jiří Dolejš for the KSČM (Communists). Among the foreign guests attending the Hradec Králové meeting were Christian Rupp from Austria, responsible for e-government development; the Chairman of TeleCities, Chris Newby from Liverpool; and important delegations from Visegrad countries.

The programme of the national part of the conference was, as usual, ample indeed. Alongside the issues of e-government at the European, national, regional and local level, also discussed were the development of ICT use in public administration and extension of electronic services for citizens. Other relevant topics included portals, communication infrastructure of public administration IS, e-learning, interoperability, geographic information systems and security issues. Intensively discussed were more extensive use of information technologies in tourism and the development of e-tourism. The attention of participants was also drawn to the issues related to digital television and IP TV, projects supported by the broadband forum and financed from EU structural funds.

The interest in the ninth edition of the ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS conference yet again surpassed the expectations of the organisers and, similarly to the previous year, the capacity of the Aldis Congress Centre was virtually utilised to the full. All those who participate in development of e-Government on local, regional, state and European level wanted to use the unique opportunity for meeting colleagues, exchanging experience and gaining the necessary know-how. Compared with last year, there was an increased interest in presentation of newly implemented solutions, transfer of experience among individual authorities and workplaces, as well as new possibilities of solutions to various agendas and processes. Also present were more than one hundred exhibiting suppliers of ICT and various special solutions for the public administration area. The possibility of using their own stand or place for presentation was used by the creators of several projects receiving prizes in the EuroCrest and other competitions, Golden Crest, Biblioweb and Geoapplication of the Year.



Evaluation

Visegrad conference, which was held as a part of the ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS conference already for the third time in succession, presented this year other two key themes in addition to the traditional issues of e-government and electronic services for the citizens of V4 countries. Much interest was paid right to the first theme--gender issues and questions concerning equality of women in approach to ICT and availability of electronic services provided by public administration. The second particularly interesting theme of V4 DIS was the role of information technologies in tourism, mainly questions connected with V4 portal, promotion of separate destinations, roles of national and regional portals and significance of internet promotion of the states.

The president of the Senate of Parliament of the Czech Republic Premysl Sobotka, under whose personal auspices the Visegrad conference V4 DIS was held, reviews the meeting in the following words: "It is not by far the matter that this event is at present rightly considered the most important meeting of its kind not only in the new member countries of European Union, but that it deals with themes closely connected with something which we got used to calling eGovernment or eState. This conference has its special significance also in the fact that exchange of information takes place at the level of the countries that have common historical experience, similar economic potential and also the same length of period of membership in European Union and thus also related problems in some spheres of their activity. I therefore believe that right here there will take place successful discovering of common procedures in designing new applications of information and communication technologies in public administration."

Visitors placed three of the blocks of the V4DIS conference in "Top Ten" blocks of the whole ISSS/LORIS/V4DIS event. Crowded conference halls and interested listeners asking questions and actively participating in the discussions are the proof, that the choice of the topics of the blocks and speeches as well as the choice of speakers was fitting the demand of the visitors.

In this way, the organisers want to contribute to accelerating the development of services of European public administration institutions.

Welcome to Poznań

Sightseeing in Poznań can be done in a variety of ways. Lovers of old monuments can choose a tour of historic places-from the Gothic cathedral in Ostrów Tumski, through the Old Market, with its Renaissance burgher houses and the Town Hall, to the Baroque Fara church.

A trip to the Poznań International Fair can be complemented with a stroll down the streets of turn-of-the-century art-deco tenement houses.

The visitor can choose a tour of museums, and there are 20 of them in the city ranging from art, applied arts, ethnography, musical instruments to war memorabilia and literature museums.

Nature lovers will enjoy the prospect of visiting two zoological gardens, a botanical garden and arboretum, a palm house (palmiarnia), and numerous parks and nature reserves.

If the visitor wants to spend their leisure time pursuing sports activities, he or she will not be short of places to go. On Malta, there is always something interesting to do, regardless of the season of the year. In summer, swimming might be enticing, and a skiing slope is open all year round (skis and ski-shoes can be rented on site), as is a toboggan run. The area around the lake is an attractive place to go for a walk, a bike ride, or do some roller skating/roller blading.

For those who like longer hikes on foot, there are five well marked tourist routes weaving through charming green areas on the city outskirts. The most interesting one goes through Morasko and the Meteonte reserve. The longest one, 13.5 km, starts in Golęcin, passes along the Rusalka Lake, through Strzeszyn, along the Kierskie Lake and ends at Krzyżowiki. As many as four lakes are located within the city borders: natural ones Kierskie and Strzeszyńskie, and the artificial Rusalka and Malta. All of them are used for recreational purposes, although sailing is best done on Kierskie, and canoeing and rowing on Malta, which is the site of world, European, national, and regional level championships in those two disciplines.

The green areas of Poznań can also be admired from horseback. Horse-riding enthusiasts can find appropriate mounts at the Wola Horseback Riding Centre (Centrum Wyszokolenia Jeździeckiego).

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Public services focus of the site

Services on the Constanta City Hall website are mainly focused on Constanta citizens, but useful information for tourists are also provided, and a special English version of the page was created for foreign visitors. Citizens and tourists can easily find everything about the City Authorities, organizational structure of the City Hall, legislative acts, resolutions of the City Council, City Hall projects, city annual budget, latest news, forms, contacts, etc. There are separate links to tourism and investors web portals for better servicing their need for specific information.



Public services objectives of this web site:

*** *Useful and updated information from the administration*
Information on the web site are continuously updated. The structure and navigation have been made clearer, so the users can easily find and read what they want from the large amount of information available.

*** *Local community involvement in public administration*
One of the City Hall objectives is to involve citizens into the discussions of the projects. The municipality publishes the projects that are going to be discussed in the City Council meeting in a special section of this site. All the members of the community can now express their opinion regarding the City Hall projects published on site by sending on-line their comments and proposals to a responsible municipality specialist, special designated for this activity.

*** *Reduction of bureaucracy and time saving*
On the websites it is possible to find, download and print all necessary documents and forms on specific themes. When the current legislation will be modified or new legislation approved, it will enable us to accept applications that have been submitted by e-mail. Furthermore, the citizens who have been submitted an application to the City Hall, and are waiting for an answer for their request or an authorization, can now find out the current status of their application (approved, unapproved, still working) and it's exact location (the clerk who is actually analyzing the application). This is possible by the implementation of a new Document Management Program in the City Hall, which allow electronic archive, monitoring of all registered applications and documents and soon will allow electronic signature.

*** *Improved Communication between citizens and administration*
Citizens can very easily find the working program, e-mail address, telephone number and office address of any City Hall clerk and they can send their questions to the administration via e-mail. Within the administration, information can be accessed quicker. For emergencies, the City Hall offers a hot-line.



*** *Transparency of public administration*
Visitors can find complete information about the City Hall (organization schema, City Hall offices and contacts, declarations of interests of all the city clerks, working program, Mayor's biography and Mayor's Decisions, annual budget and tax system, annual City Hall newsletter) and also about the City Council (the political structure of the City Council, declaration of interest of all City Councillors, City Council Decisions, working program). All the achievements and projects are described in detail, for citizens to know and understand how the City Hall improved the city life. The latest news in public administration are published on the main page, also available in XML format, and citizens or other web sites may subscribe to receive the information.


*** *Availability and accessibility:*
It is planned to make the offered web page services more user-friendly for those who are blind or partially sighted. Information is to be offered in several different languages as soon as possible.

Future Projects in site development

*** *On-line submission of applications and electronic signature*
Citizens will be able to submit all the necessary documents (scanned or completed on-line forms) and to electronically sign their applications. This will dramatically reduce the paperwork and bureaucracy, and will allow time savings for both the citizens and City Hall clerk. More than that, a certain type of document regarding a company or a citizen will be uploaded to the database only once, and later be used for subsequent applications on specific themes if necessary. Currently, we are implementing the electronic signature in the City Hall, to facilitate internal communication and to reduce the paperwork.

Within the programme of a gala meeting on the eve of the opening of the international ISSS 2006 conference in Hradec Králové, the results of the @ Czech competition were announced. This year, the prize was awarded to two public administration subjects that have significantly contributed to information society development – “Subcommittee for information systems in public administration of the Committee for public administration, regional development and the environment of the Chamber of Deputies of the Parliament of the CR” and the “Ministry of Informatics of the CR”. The Union of Towns and Communities of Slovak Republic

The Union works on voluntary principles and gathers more than 96% of the towns and communities of the whole Slovakia. On 16th of January 1990, during the Constitutive meeting of The Union of Towns and Communities of Czechoslovakia, preparation committee agreed on establishing an independent union, which was founded on 21st March 1990 in Zilina.

The Union of Towns and Communities of Slovak Republic (Združenie miest a obcí Slovenska or ZMOS) was founded as organization representing towns and communities in negotiations with National council and government, as well as central state administration bodies, international organizations and other subjects.

Its main goals are to advocate and secure the interests of its members while paying full respect to their independence and sovereignty and in accordance to the national legal system and international treaties and pacts. To act as an advisor during the legislative process and enactment of the bills related to local government, to help its members with the execution of their duties and solution of problems in the area of local and regional government.

Delegates of ZMOS sitting in consultative bodies of government and ministries play significant role in the processes mentioned above.

The Union of Towns of Slovakia

The Union of Towns and Cities of the Slovak Republic was founded at the initiative of the Club of Mayors of the Slovak Republic on April 29, 1994 in Košice. The towns and cities of Košice, Spišská Nová Ves, Kežmarok, Levoča, Starý Smokovec, Rajec, Banská Bystrica, Stará Ľubovňa, Nová Dubnica, Trenčianske Teplice, Nové Mesto nad Váhom and Pezinok established the UTC as a voluntary association of local governments in the Slovak Republic. In addition to the twelve charter members, a number of other cities attended as observers. The Union was officially registered with state authorities on May 12, 1995 in Bratislava. Today, the Union's members represent approximately 2 million people. Since July 8, 1999 is the Bratislava Development joint stock company an extraordinary member of the association. The honorary membership was attributed to nine personalities. Mr. Michal Kováč, former President of the Slovak Republic is also the honorary member. On June 20, 1997, the Sixth Annual Assembly of the Union decided to modify the charter to allow smaller communities to join organization. Accordingly, the name of the organization was changed to the Union of Towns, Cities and Villages of the SR. On the ninth Annual Assembly of the Union, which took place on July 7, 2000, the Union reverted to its original mission –

represent mainly towns and cities. Also the name of Union was changed to The Union of Towns and Cities of Slovakia (UTCS). On March 27, 2001 the Extraordinary Associate Congress with the Association of Towns of Slovakia took place. Today its 43 members include mainly large towns and also 8 municipalities. Extraordinary members are municipal parts of Bratislava - Old Town, Karlova Ves and Ružinov. The Union co-ordinates its activities with the Club of Mayors of the SR, the Association of City Managers (APMUS), the Association of Local Economists of the SR (AKE), the Association of Historic Cities and Villages of Slovakia (ZHMOS), particular regional associations of towns and villages and other organisations. It also has broad contacts and ongoing co-operation with home and foreign institutions, foundations, and non-governmental organisations. The last, 11th Congress of UTCS took place on July 3, 2001 in Bratislava. The Congress elected the President, members of the Presidium and Audit Committee for next two-year period.

Main goals:

The Union and its members are working for:

- a complex and systematic reform of government, which is effective, promotes the decentralisation of power on the principles of subsidiarity and democracy, and strengthens local and regional governments;
- maximal economic and fiscal independence for local governments;
- mutual co-operation of cities for solving common problems and co-operation with surrounding communities, with mutual accountability for regional development
- restoration and protection of the environment and cultural heritage, on the basis of long-term sustainability;

Membership and Organisational structure:

- Members of the Union are cities which agree with the main goals, activities, and the charter of the UTCS, and in which the city council approved membership. Members of the Union are also villages that agree with the main goals, activities, and the charter of the UTCS, in which the local council approved membership and that became members of the UTCS before July 7, 2000. Membership is based on a written application. Steering committee members of the UTCS are required to pay initiation fees and annual dues, according to population;
- Extraordinary Members are municipal parts of Bratislava and Košice which agree with the main goals, activities, and the charter of the UTCS, and in which the local council approved membership.
- Associate Members of the UTCS are legal entities, which have interest in co-operating with the UTCS;
- Honorary Members of the UTCS are physical or legal entities, which have a substantial interest in public life and the activities of the UTCS;
- The Congress is the highest organ of the Union, which must meet at least once a year. Between conventions, the highest organ is the presidium, which meets at least every two months;
- The President is the statutory executive of the UTCS. He represents the UTCS and is assisted by first, second vice presidents;

- The General Secretariat handles day-to-day administrative activities of the UTCS and is directed by the General Secretary. The General Secretariat is headquartered in Bratislava; The General Secretary represents the UTCS, as authorised by the president and presidium, and in accordance with the charter.

Regional and special Interest Clubs

UTCS members may establish clubs based on mutual interests or regions. These clubs provide a forum for UTCS members and cities to address common problems. Clubs have the right to present proposals to the UTCS presidium and convention on activities of the UTCS and to recommend financial obligations for specific projects. According to the charter, club leaders must be members of the UTCS.

The UTCS supports a number of projects, which could help to realise its goals. They include:

- Strategy, conception of the Public Administration Reform and the legislative norms in connection with the process of decentralisation and democratisation
- New model of Financing Public Administration and preparing fiscal systems of the repartition on the national and regional level
- New concept of the Housing Policy and the local and regional development based on the principle of the sustainability
- Transformation of Waterworks and Sewerage company, public corporation, to towns, cities and villages associated in regional waterworks companies

The Hungarian National Association of Local Authorities (TÖÖSZ)

TÖÖSZ was established on 10 March 1989, with the aim to give assistance to the development of settlement autonomy and to participate in the creation of a social, economic and legal environment friendly to local governments. The number of settlements was 152 at the time of the establishment of the Association.

TÖÖSZ differs from other interest representing associations of local authorities not only because it is the oldest with the largest number of members, but also because it comprises all types of local authorities (the capital, the capital districts, village- communes, large village - large communes, town, town with county rank and the county). TÖÖSZ aims at holding dialogues with political parties, but performs professional activity also independently of them. The local governments being members of TÖÖSZ are represented generally by their mayors in the organizations of the Association (less frequently by local assembly members or notaries). Through them almost all the political parties and other social organizations, which took part in local elections, are represented. As a consequence of the character and the results of the elections, the majority of representatives are, however, independent.

The primary tasks of TÖÖSZ are in particular:

- revealing, conciliating, mediating, protecting and representing interests,
- promotion of local self-government operation,

- encouraging the enlargement and successful operation of local government assets,
- professional and organizational support to the cooperation of local authorities,
- conciliations concerning the budgetary decisions of the Parliament,
- giving an opinion of draft acts and other state decision drafts,
- exercising the right of presentation,
- goodwill missions concerning debates between members,
- participating in the international cooperation of local authorities, promoting international relations of the members,
- organizing different services,
- operating consultative, interest revealing and coordinating forums for the members,
- promoting information flow and relations between members,
- assisting members in case of grievances and in legal affairs,
- promoting the social control of power exertion.

TÖOSZ has given opinion, ever since its establishment, on several hundred legal regulations, it has initiated in several cases the preparation or modification of acts concerning the interests of local authorities. In the case of otherwise not avertable violations of local government interests the Association applied to the courts, it required even the intervention of the Constitutional Court. Among these some issues can be mentioned, already known by the public and resulting in granting additional assets to local authorities, for instance: proceedings of the Constitutional Court in connection with the transfer of real estates(precedence-lawsuits in the Supreme Court concerning the ownership of pharmacy centres (proceedings in connection with the ownership of centrally located plots (the decision of the Constitutional Court No. 36/1998 (IX. 16) in the issue of the assets of public energy utilities, further the legal decision of the Supreme Court No. 3/1998 on public administration.

Since its creation TÖOSZ is an active partner in multilateral and bilateral European international local authority co-operation.

TÖOSZ obtained an observer status in the Standing Conference of the European Local and Regional Authorities of the Council of Europe (CLRAE) in December 1989, and then its representatives began to work as members of the congressional delegation of the Hungarian local authorities.

The Association is in contact with the International Union of Local Authorities (IULA) since March 1990. In 1999, it became a full member of the CEMR and the IULA and is also part of the newly created World Organization, the United Local Authorities and Cities.

The TÖOSZ plays an active part in the realization of the program of the CEEC-LOGON international network led by the Association of Austrian cities and towns.

The Association has reached important results with the Committee of the Regions, out of 12 representatives of the Hungarian delegation to the CoR, 2 persons were delegated by TÖOSZ.

As part of the already mentioned multilateral international local authority co-operations and bilateral relations with the Austrian, German, French, Finnish,

Slovak, Swiss, Polish, Greek and Italian national local government associations, TÖOSZ also contributed to the preparation of its local government members to the accession to the European Union. In the course of its international activities, the Association works together with the Integration Office of the Ministry of Interior and makes use of the information force of the TÖOSZ Newsletter, Journal, Website and its Series of Publications titled Best Practices, in Hungarian „Jótár”.

Further current projects in the Association are as follows: the TÖOSZ is the Hungarian anchor of the Local Government Information Network, it has a representative in the Elected Women Section of the CEMR and thus actively participates in the programs of this section. The Association also acts as partner in the International Communal Network led by the Association of Austrian Municipalities and function within the Interreg III/C project.

The Union of Towns and Communities of the Czech Republic

The Union of Towns and Communities of the Czech Republic is a voluntary non-political, non-governmental organization whose regular members are communities in accordance with the law on communities. The Union's basic aim is to defend the common interests and rights of the communities that make it up. At present, the Union comprises approximately 2,200 communities, that is, about 34%, in which around 7 million people live, representing more than 70% of the citizens of the Czech Republic. The Union is a constructive partner of government and parliamentary political representatives. It contributes to proposed legislative measures by commenting on legal norms in areas concerning local administration. The concept of the “Union” refers first and foremost to village and town mayors who, beyond the concerns of their own community, also devote their time to the problems of local administration in general.

Foreign Cooperation and International Relations

The Union of Towns and Communities of the Czech Republic is creating conditions for integrating Czech municipal offices into various forms of cooperation in the area of activities by local administration and local government bodies in Europe and other countries of the world. The Union works together with similar partner associations in other countries and also oversees cooperation between individual communities in this country and abroad. The Union is a member of the worldwide organizations IULA (International Union of Local Administrations) and CEMR (Council of European Municipalities and Regions). Thanks to its membership in CEMR, Union representatives have succeeded in gaining access to the Board of Regions, an EU advisory body and thus they have gradually been able to get acquainted with EU mechanisms and programs in practice. Members of the Union are also represented in the Congress of European Local and Regional Authorities. Furthermore, the Union coordinates a program of partnership cooperation for towns and communities.

1. The Union's priorities in field of international activities are as follows:

- to provide exact information about European Union, functioning of EU institutions and EU funding to Czech towns and municipalities and equipped them with knowledge in field of municipal administration and management capacities;
- to defend rights and to lobby for interests of Czech municipalities on national and European level;
- to promote twinning cooperation among Czech municipalities and municipalities abroad and assist with creation of new twinning arrangements;
- to promote mutual co-operation with European local government associations from European Union as well from candidate and East European countries;

The Union and its members continuously participate in international projects, which aim at experience and information exchange on EU issues and preparation of local governments for accession. For example our association is actively involved in the international network LOGON–Local Governments Network of Central and Eastern European Countries and in project Local Government Support Programme (LGSP-CE).

Committee for information systems of towns and communities (ISMO committee)

The Union of Czech Towns and Communities (www.smocr.cz) is an open interest, non-party and non-governmental organisation asserting the common interests and rights of municipalities. It proceeds in the spirit of principles from which the European Charter of Local Self-government issues. At the present time, the Union associates more than 2,300 towns and communities inhabited by a total of seven million people, i.e. more than 70% of the citizens of the Czech Republic.

Within the Union of Czech Towns and Communities, a number of specialist committees work as special advisory bodies to the Presidium of the Union. One of the most active is the Committee for Information Systems of Towns and Communities (ISTC–www.munet.cz/ismo), focused on information systems for self-government. It engages in promoting use of the Internet in the work of town and municipal authorities. It cooperates with ministries in preparing standards for public administration and self-government information systems, participates in organising specialist conferences and, naturally, expresses its opinions on proposed legal rules pertaining to informatics and concerning towns and communities. An integral part of the Committee's activity is cooperation foreign partners.
